MY TIPS TO HELP CHILPREN ENJOY BOOKS

- *When choosing a picture book, parents can consider what their child is visually drawn to. Are they mostly attracted to bright colours and simple art or do they enjoy books with plenty of details that encourage them to explore every page?
- *When reading a picture book, find creative ways to stimulate your kid's imagination. The opportunities of creating links between a storybook and real-life events are endless.
- *Encourage them to draw a picture based on their favourite book character. Illustrations are the perfect way to introduce a child to art and media like: watercolour, acrylic and pastels.
